(RCFS) has received several inquiries regarding recent reports published by the U.S. Department of Justice and the *Tribune-Review* concerning a former employee of an unnamed nonprofit guardianship organization in Western Pennsylvania who pleaded guilty to bank fraud.

Because the organization referenced in these reports was not identified, we believe it is important to provide the following clarification.

River Communities Fiduciary Services, Inc. (RCFS) is not the organization referenced in these reports. The individual identified in the federal criminal case has never been employed by River Communities Fiduciary Services, Inc. in any capacity. This matter does not involve our organization, our clients, the funds entrusted to our care, or any member of our staff.
